EIGHTH ANNUAL JUDICIAL SYMPOSIUM ON CIVIL JUSTICE ISSUES

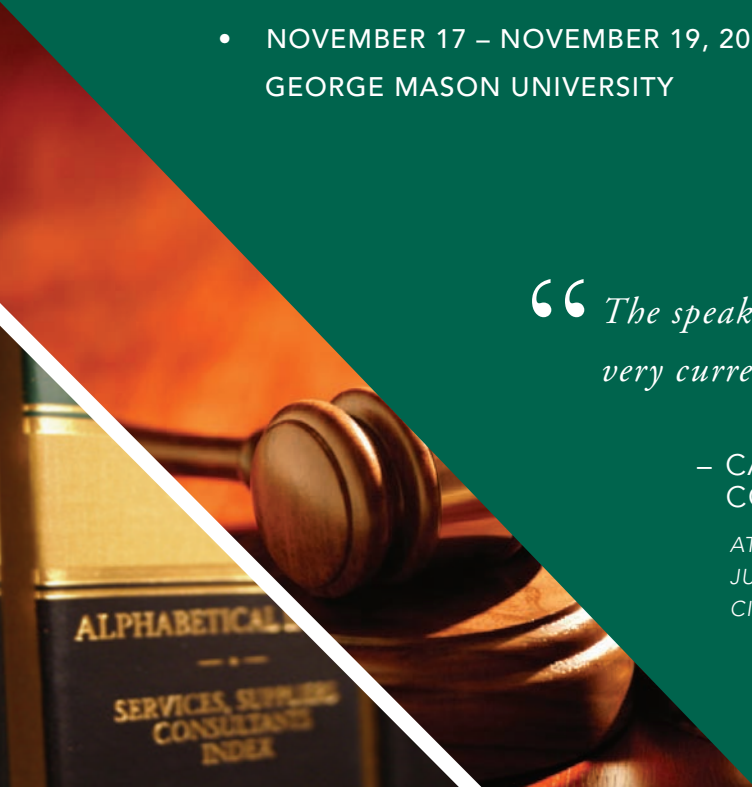

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Judges must serve on general jurisdiction courts or higher. Judges from courts of limited jurisdiction (e.g., criminal courts or family courts) should not apply. Judges from certain specialized courts (e.g., tax, bankruptcy or business courts) are welcome to apply. Judges must plan to stay on the bench for at least three years following completion of the program.

NO TUITION, TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT AND LODGING INCLUDED

Mason JEP Programs are offered with no tuition; reading materials, hotel rooms, and group meals are included. Travel expenses are reimbursed 100% up to \$300 plus 50% of the amount exceeding \$300 with a maximum reimbursement of \$500. Those traveling from Alaska and Hawaii are reimbursed 100% up to \$1000 plus 50% of additional reimbursable expenses.
